


Free Multidisciplinary Articles and Global Health DVDs Offered to Thousands of University Libraries, Institutions and Organizations in 138 Countries

Update of July 1, 2013: **Packets have been sent to 55 countries**

The <u>Global Development And Environment Institute</u> (GDAE) at Tufts University, co-directed by Dr. Neva Goodwin, has released an extraordinary collection of publications in the social and environmental sciences and global health and is now distributing it with special attention to



those institutions that are most in need of library resources. The Social Science Library: Frontier Thinking in Sustainable

Development and Human Well-Being (SSL) is an electronic collection of scholarly writings that includes complete bibliographical data (including abstracts) of nearly 10,000 entries in the disciplines of Anthropology, Economics, History, Philosophy, Political Science, Social Psychology, and Sociology. The SSL comes in a cardboard packet that looks like the one shown above, containing a wealth of material within a 15 x 15 x 5 cm (6 x 6 x 2 inches) box.

In addition to a cover letter, a poster and descriptive brochures, each packet contains:

- · A copy of the SSL on USB drive
- · A copy of the SSL on 2 CDs
- · 2 CDs of publications on sustainable development from UNRISD
- · A CD on environment topics from Worldwatch Institute
- · Four hours of multimedia DVDs that accompany Horizon International's book
- "Water and Sanitation Related Diseases and the Environment: Challenges, Interventions, and Preventive Measures."

Produced for use as teaching tools in classrooms and communities, by organizations, researchers and policy makers, the DVDs contain 16 videos and 4 short-clip videos. For example, videos on water treatment and safe storage, successful household-centered sanitation systems, measures to prevent water pollution, dengue, cholera, schistosomiasis and trachoma, and the successful effort leading to the eradication Guinea worm disease. They also contain 525 illustrations, tables, and maps from the text, chapter abstracts written specifically for the DVDs, and text content and images not found in the book.
